the principles of social justice: they provide a way of assigning rights and duties in the basic institutions of society and they define the appropriate distribution of the benefits and burdens of social cooperation.

Social justice has equal entitlement to social and cultural rights and understands the rights of others to obtain social security. In addition, as examples show, social inequities may arise when there is a lack of acceptance and tolerance for differences, such as intolerance for differences in race, ethnic and cultural group, religion, language barriers, socioeconomic status, disabilities, age, gender, and sexual orientation. These intolerances may lead to discrimination, biases, prejudice, unfair treatment, and, at times, interpersonal violence. **Types of Justice**

Justice in an action that is compatible with the requirements of the exiting law. The rules are implemented based on the societal norms with the purpose that all the members of the society are granted to receive fair treatment in all aspects of life. Issues of justice derive from various spheres, each of which expresses the principle of justice in its own way resulting in different types of justice.

- 1. Distributive justice is more concerned with the economic system where all members of the society are ensured to get fair share of the resources available.
- 2. Procedural justice focusses on the fair treatment in a decision – making. Members of the society are granted to experience rules which are impartial and consistent.
- 3. Retributive justice focusses on the mutual fair treatment. People deserve to be treated in the same way they treat others.
- 4. Retroactive justice is focussed on punishment as a response to injustice or wrongdoing.

Immorality is often used as a synonym for this. The concept is different for different worldviews of persons and societies. Conflicts in definitions of social injustice is increasingly a platform of emerging political parties. For some societies, social injustice includes the distribution of advantages and disadvantages in society aren't equal. For other societies, social injustice includes repressing peoples' ability to be fruitful for themselves and the society they are in. Social injustice is used as a slogan by certain societies to oppose other societies' definition of social justice.

Furthermore, Social injustice is defined as a concept relating to the claimed unfairness or injustice of a society in its divisions of rewards and burdens and other incidental inequalities. It arises when the distribution of advantages and disadvantages in society aren't equal. Social injustice came about when sin infected humanity in the Garden of Eden. And then, Social injustice is a concept that refers to an unfairness in a society that is based on inequalities. These may or may not be legal wrong, but more of a moral wrong. These types of injustices occur when the society doesn't have an equal distribution of advantages and disadvantages. Some of the causes most often seen in social injustice are the unequal distribution of wealth, racism, ageism, and sexism. An example to give of a widespread social injustice would be

denying females equal opportunity in the workplace due to thinking they are inferior to men. Finally, when human rights are abused, it shows the social injustice.

Social justice means that the rights of all people in our community are considered in a fair and equitable manner. While equal opportunity targets everyone in the community, social justice targets the marginalised and disadvantaged groups of people in the society. All the people must have rights to live, to speak and to get freedom.

Socrates claims that the injustice would create disunity and weakness rather than strength. He says that injustices cause quarrels and weaken the group whether it is a state or a family. "... whether it occurs in a state or family or army or in anything else: it renders it incapable of any common action because of factions and quarrels, and sets it at variance with itself and with its opponents and with whatever is just" (Plato, p. 38). Moreover, injustices produce hatred between people even in the ruling elite. So, people even in the ruling elite would try to supplant each other and the state will be weak and illegitimate because of the corruption and political struggles.

Socrates tells that social injustice forms create weakness rather than strength. The people must create social justice in everything so that it helps humans lead a truly human life.

Mental Anguish

Mental anguish or mental suffering which includes fright, feelings of distress, anxiety, depression, grief and psychosomatic physical symptoms. It is distinguished from physical pain due to an injury, but it may be considered in awarding damages for physical injury due to a defendant's negligence or intentionally inflicting harm. Analysis And Finding

1. Analysis

Luciana Giordano was her father's favorite. In many ways, this is an ideal situation for any girl to get his wish. In other respects, it is a disaster. There has never been a girl who kept a very tight like a beloved daughter - only Gaetano Giordano.

Luciana is her father's favorite. Her father did nothing to keep her from the dangers that exist around it. This story began when the father and his family moved to Venice. This is because the import and export business growing demand it to move with his family from town to Turin town esteemed sinful.

Gaetano did not want to move to Venice, but the business of export / import burgeoning demand it to move with his family from town to Turin town esteemed sinful at sea. Venice is still the center of the universe in the eighteenth century, with the lines throughout the Mediterranean, of Constantine and the outside world. However, fear of moral purity Gaetano child - a good Catholic kid hive of crime and debauchery like this. Prejudices about the city grew stronger when she suffered a sort of fever and died just a year after they got there. The situation was exactly as he had expected. It is no longer fond of children but make depressed inner child. It would be fatal to the health of children.

Luciana enjoys torturing her servants. The woman is an idiot, chosen specifically because of its inability to expand the boundaries Luciana little world apart to show it how to sew. She did not quite know how to be dangerous, even though he was very clever in ensuring that Luciana goes no farther than the middle of a small courtyard palazzo unless they go to church.

Luciana accompanied by a waiter that idiot. The maid was Mary. Mary only know how to sew. She taught Luciana how to sew. Although, Luciana did, but her heart was very hurt. She sometimes imagined tobe at home that is similar to a prison. She was not allowed out of the house. She just let go and pray how to get out of the challenges it faces. Luciana classified as smart and creative child. She used the opportunity to leave the house when she went to church. She was like out of the cage when that day.

One night, when she was in her room looking at the activities going on around the house though a window that's the only one available for her to see the activity outside her home. She was sitting down and enjoying the busy activity every night.

Maria could not, however, stop Luciana looked out of her bedroom window in front of the house when the whole house was asleep. After all those silent, Luciana will sit on the window sill, imagining herself as a princess in a fairy tale commonly told her mother at the time of going to bed, before her mother died and all the happiness drained out of the house like color fastness of fabric dyed with indiscriminate in rain. Luciana's father had covered the house with the curtains grief and never been opened since then. Her father also tried to keep the mind Luciana curtain that covered also by grief. Luciana also studied the night time with a boat full of revelers, who could be heard long before they are seen. The boat was carrying three musicians who play the same songs every night, while passengers singing voice getting louder as they lack the more. They always be captured in the way home. Luciana had to memorize the songs by heart and never once get a pinch on the hand because it is the one singing the song very obscene temple when he went around the house.

Where did you learn dirty words like that? Maria asked him.

I definitely hear it in my sleep. I do not even know what the words meant, the Luciana lie. But the most anticipated boat Luciana is hidden affairs. Said brother - my little, her father did not agree with the widespread use of masks precisely because it is very leveler and liberating. When everyone wore masks, a beggar can talk to a noblewoman. A duke can mingle among his followers without recognizable and so he could know exactly what they think about him. My father thought the mask encourages dishonest behavior. My brother also believes otherwise how could a reigning duke well if he does not know the true wishes of its people without being recognized? It is true, how people - ordinary people can make their true feelings known except through the disguise?

Luciana wish had a mask. But she does not want to wear a mask types offered for her father. Although her father had made her spend her childhood behind to plague beak mask so she does not end up like her mother's tragic, recently, father said if she wanted to hide her face from the sight of the Lord every day, then she should wear muta servetta models, a mask which only can be retained in place by a latch that is bitten so she could not speak bad as she put it on.

I did not dare to wait in the window that night, for fear that arises when the gondola, the gondola would be filled with men - young men who come to laugh at me, but at one o'clock half past midnight there was a knock on my window. I pulled the covers up to my ear when a battle raging inside me. Answering a knock at the risk of humiliation ignore it and lose one - my only chance for freedom? My visitor turns are persistent. I finally decided to take my chance. The visitor was the gondolier and he came with another letter.

Madonna is sad from the open window, I read your letter with great sadness and heavy hearts. How is it possible that a beauty like yours should be hidden? Not just your physical beauty, but also your intelligence? It is a far greater crime. Only allowed to read the Bible, 'the contradiction book' is a criminal act that is wasted - wasted your young mind. How lucky if is so because God, perhaps, has sent a correspondent who is perfect for you ... You said that you wanted a decent education. Do you want to know about science, philosophy and commerce. I can help vou with all of this. I myself was educated at Padua University. I was fortunate to have been taught by people with the best minds in the whole of Europe. In addition, I have a lot of books - good books in my house and I would feel more than happy to tell you everything I know Of course, I could still tell it was him, but I'm afraid it will be bad for you, so there is no useful to make your father angry now.

Her teacher wrote back Luciana. He tells her attention to the condition of Luciana. He was sorry for the actions of her parents are considered criminal. He actually contacted her parents, but he worried, Luciana's parents will be angry with him. Luciana do not yet know the identity of the teacher well moreover her father.

Her teacher hopes, Luciana is taught about the world, but she is limited only by letter. He wants Luciana come to his home to teach and answer Luciana confusion of books which she read from her teacher.

My brother, although he two years older than me, not so much bigger. I can equip it with a shoe costume itself. Of course, my father told me not wearing any shoes from the design people may think it's wrong costume. Luciana tried to sew her own shoes, but she was afraid of her father's orders not to use goods made in other people. What an adventure that I experienced, for the sake of our meeting. Venice is so different from the light illuminated. Normally, I'd be scared, but my mission made me stronger. I need to see the teacher directly without a lattice between us. I do not have time to continue my education about fashion in a way little by little because I have received so far. Not that I wish to precede my father's attempts to get me to marry. 2. FINDING

1. Distributive Injustice

Distributive injustice, also known as economic injustice, is about unfairness in what people receive from goods to attention. Their roots are in social order and it is at the roots of socialism, where inequality is a fundamental principle. If people do not think that they are getting their unfair share of something, they will seek first to gain what they may not deserve. They may well also seek other forms of injustice.

2. Procedural Injustice

The principle of unfairness is also found in the idea of unfair play (as opposed to the unfair share of distributive injustice).

There are several forms of injustice experienced by Luciana as follows:

Because each person has a good heart and evil.

4. Retributive Injustice

Retributive injustice works on the principle of punishment, although what constitutes unfair and improportional punishment is widely debated. While the intent may be to dissuade the perpetrator or others from future wrong-doing, the re-offending rate of many criminals indicates the limited success of this approach.

Punishment in practice is more about the unsatisfactory to the victims and those who don't care about them. Injustice is typically defined emotionally rather that with intent for unfairness or unsatisfactory.
